## **Control Measures:**

- 1. If this task is unavoidable only use equipment designed for this purpose
- 2. Do not perform this task if there are health issues that can be agrivated by using the provided appropriate equipment

Hazard: Electrical Shock or even death can result from souching live electricals with overhead cleaning equipment.

#### **Control Measures:**

- 1. Ensure the area is clear of all overhead obsticles before performing the task.
- 2. Clear passers by from the area to ensure no loose electrical equipment can be touched if an accident should occur
- 3. DO NOT perform the task if there is the risk of an electrical accident

Hazard: Repetitive Movements Repetitive movement can lead to a perminent strain injury which could be life limiting in the future.



### Control Measures:

- 1. Task not to be performed by the same individual for extended periods of time
- 2. Lightweight equipment for the purpose to be used
- 3. Take regular breaks from the activity
- 4. Correct posture to be observed while performing the task to avoid stress and strain on joints

Hazard: Public or Visitor Access Items may be accidentally dislodged and land on others if the area is not marked off and cleared of all members of the public and visitors

# **Control Measures:**

- 1. Use correct warning signs and mark the area before beginning the task
- 2. Ensure there are no overhead objects that could be dislodged whily the taks is being performed
- 3. Remove any loose overhead objects from the area to avoid them falling
- 4. Avoid leaving obsticles on the floor around the area to be cleaned so they are not tripped over
