SCOPE OF WORKS	Suction cleaning in various locations			
SAFE SEQUENCE OF WORK	 Methods and Techniques of High Level Dusting Cleaners feet are to reamin firmly on the ground at all times. Commence at top of wall, proceed along the ledges using the lip of the tool Employing horizontal strokes and working a two metre section, with overlapping strokes, continue down the wall in sections until the whole area has been covered. Remember to keep the bonnet in contact with the surface. Dust and dirt tend to gather between and on top of pipes, therefore place hook of the tool along both side of the pipe to remove. Check bonnet and remove the dust by brushing or shaking into a rubbish sack. Alternatively clean bonnet outside the building. When the task has been completed, remove the head from the tool and brush it thoroughly with a stiff brush and return tidily to the Cleaner Cupboard. Methods and Techniques of Low-Level Dusting Dust systematically: Vertical surfaces top to bottom Horizontal surfaces: use straight, overlapping strokes Re-fold duster as required to avoid re-depositing dust on clean surfaces. Replace duster if necessary Lift phones/keyboards to clean under Remove all materials and machinery to cleaning cupboard Do not over stretch when cleaning high level areas Do not move computer monitors or paperwork on desks or surfaces
